### **NEWS:**

In an effort to show our Oxford pride, provide a safe and respectful City for our neighbors, community members, businesses and visitors, the Mayor and City Council would like to remind everyone that on March 12, 2024 the City of Oxford adopted the International Code Council's International Property Maintenance Code.

The code is intended to provide requirements addressing public health, safety and welfare as they relate to the use and maintenance of existing structures and premises (A lot, plot or parcel of land, easement or public way, including any structures.). The code requires existing structures and premises that are not in compliance with the code to be altered or repaired to meet the code. Owners of properties found in violation will be sent a Notices of Violation as allowed by the City Code. The Notice of Violation will state the type of violation, the corrective action needed to abate the violation, and a date that the violation must be abated.

If you receive a Notice of Violation and believe that you are not in violation of the City Code, you will be given the opportunity to contact the City to review the situation. If you receive a Notice of Violation and intend to bring the property into compliance with the Code, but cannot meet the stated deadline, you will need to contact the City to work with you for a short extension. If you do not take the requested action or make other arrangements with the City by the specified date, the City will begin formal enforcement action. You will not receive an additional notification before the City begins formal enforcement action.

Violations of the maintenance code is a municipal infraction and may be subject to a penalty as provided for in subsection 1-4-1B of the City Code

(https://codelibrary.amlegal.com/codes/oxfordia/latest/oxford\_ia/0-0-0-99), or by City abatement and assessment of costs against the responsible party, at the discretion of the City, and as provided by the Iowa Code. 1-4-1B Infractions.
